Luke 22:14-23

Two Questions:

1. Who should participate in the Lord's Supper?
2. Why is the Lord's Supper reserved for these people?

1. The Lord's Supper is for \_\_\_\_\_ because the act of receiving the elements proclaims, "I \_\_\_\_\_ in this Jesus who gave his body and shed his blood to save me." (Luke 22:19; Romans 10:9-10)  
We are saved by what Jesus \_\_\_\_\_ for us, not by what we \_\_\_\_\_ for Jesus.
