“Many who have given themselves up to the leading of the Holy Spirit get into a _____ of great bondage and are tortured because they have leadings that they fear may be from God but of which they are not sure. If they do not obey these leadings, they are fearful they have disobeyed God and sometimes imagine that they have grieved the Holy Spirit because they did not follow His leading. This is all unnecessary. Let us settle it in our minds that God’s guidance is _____ guidance. ‘God is light, and in Him is no darkness at all’ (1 John 1:5). Any leading that is not perfectly clear is not from Him—that is, if our wills are absolutely surrendered to Him.”
